


As well as a high mortality rate, the epidemic affected many aspects of society. New approaches, particularly the scientific method, led to significant changes, including identifying how blood flowed around the body and the classification of diseases. 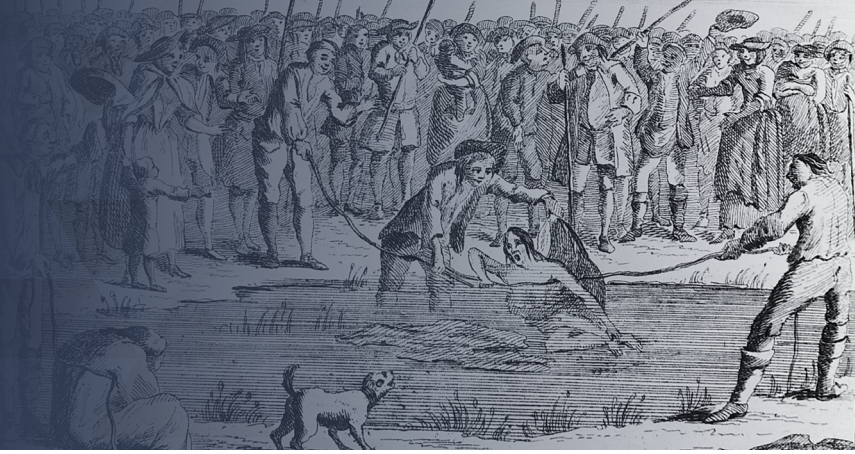
